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#### ALONE and SAD

One of the biggest issues we have seen over the years in working with families who have a Loved One diagnosed with a dementia, is the loneliness. Suddenly or slowly, there is a decline in cognitive functions and that person is no longer the same. They are not able to do simple tasks, may start wandering, or cannot be left alone. So now we have to start making new plans to ensure we have a break to socialize and our Loved One is safe. There are many kinds of classes, senior centers, adult day care centers, dining sites, and veterans' programs. We often have to get out of our comfort zones and seek services and places to meet our new way of life, to make new friends, to help us understand that things will not be the 'way they were' and to give ourselves permission to join a new group to laugh again and to share stories. There is a term called "Married Widow/Widower". This is a different way of life for most. But the most important takeaway is that even if the wellspouse starts to date – (usually a very difficult and thought-provoking decision), he or she will not abandon their spouse who is now in longterm care. They will continue to make sure their needs are being met, and visit, and fully take care of legal and financial matters. Sometimes it is the children of that relationship that object to mom or dad seeing someone. But they are not experiencing the loneliness and depression that can occur. Joining a support group can offer a non-judgmental setting and validation that you are caring for your own mental health during some very difficult years. Dementia can take away so much, but it also teaches us compassion, wisdom and gives us the opportunity to look at things from an unexpected perspective.
